Key vocabulary

Mandir: a Hindu temple

Puja: Hindu worship, prayers

Murtis: statues

Dharma: responsibility and duty

Characteristic: Feature or quality

Qualities: Honesty, respect, fairness, forgiveness, generosity, perseverance

Vivaha: a Hindu wedding
