Wangari Maathai was the first African woman to receive the Nobel Peace Prize. Her work has led to creating significant change and a lasting impact on women's lives and the environment today.



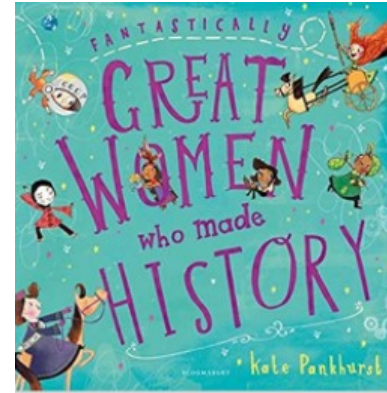
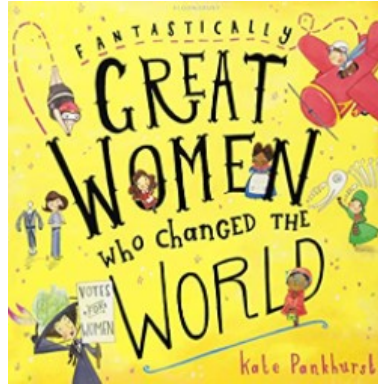
Florence Nightingale known as 'The Lady with the Lamp' was a British nurse who is known for founding modern nursing by improving the working conditions and patient care in hospitals.
